DMV is supposed to be checking dues cards, but it is the brother's responsibility to be sure and apply for the correct license plate with HA and AFM on it.

MASONIC EDUCATION

We left off last month learning (or re-learning) some key concepts as found throughout the MM degree using the Ahiman Rezon as our reference. We now touch upon three of them in depth.

"There are in this degree two classes of emblems or symbols, the first of which is

monitorial, and consists of *the Three Steps, the Pot of Incense, the Bee-Hive, the Book of Constitutions, guarded by the Tiler's Sword, the Sword, pointing to a Naked Heart, the All-seeing Eye, the Anchor and Ark, the Forty-seventh Problem of Euclid, the Hour-Glass, and the Scythe*. They are thus explained:

The Three Steps – Usually delineated upon the Master's carpet, are emblematical of the three principal stages of human life, viz: *Youth, Manhood, and Age*. In *Youth*, as Entered Apprentices, we ought industriously to occupy our minds in the attainment of useful knowledge; in *Manhood*, as Fellow Craft, we should apply our knowledge to the discharge of our respective duties to God, our neighbor, and ourselves; so that in *Age*, as Master Masons, we may enjoy the happy reflections consequent on a well-spent life, and die in the hope of a glorious immortality.



The Pot of Incense – Is an emblem of a pure heart, which is always an acceptable sacrifice to the Deity; and as this glows with fervent heat, so should our hearts continually glow with gratitude to the great beneficent Author of our existence, for the manifold blessings and comforts we enjoy.

The Bee Hive – Is an emblem of industry, and recommends the practice of that virtue to all created beings, from the highest seraph in heaven to the lowest reptile of the dust. It teaches us that as we came into the world rational and intelligent beings, so we should ever be industrious ones; never sitting down contented while our fellow creatures around us are in want, when it is in our power to relive them without inconvenience to ourselves.



 **The Book of Constitutions, Guarded by the Tiler's Sword** – Remind us that we should be ever watchful and guarded in our words and actions, particularly when before the enemies of Masonry; ever bearing in remembrance those truly Masonic virtues, *silence* and *circumspection*.

Next issue, we continue with an explanation of the symbols found in Masonry.


