Its purpose is to offer these boys a haven from troubled home-life before the ill-effects leave an indelible mark on these children's young lives. Carlos was the keynote speaker at the 3rd SC Respite Coalition Conference at St. Andrews Baptist Church on February 4th. The conference focused on how faith-based communities could provide valuable help to those with disabilities in their communities. Bro. Gibbons used his family's experiences in working through the various phases of Alzheimer's disease. You may already know that his wife, Jean, passed away from Alzheimer's in 2008. The Respite Conference was attended by 150 faith-based groups from throughout the state. Great job, Brother Carlos – you are a fine representative of your family and this lodge. ALZHEIMER'S TASK FORCE COMPLETES STATE PLAN

The Purple Ribbon Task Force Committee, authorized by concurrent resolutions of the S.C. General Assembly, has completed its year-long study and presented its proposal to the General Assembly.

The mission of the Purple Ribbon Committee was to develop a comprehensive state-wide plan for dealing with Alzheimer's disease, a progressive

disease affecting more than 80,000 SC citizens and 5 million nationally.

WB Carlos Gibbons was appointed as one member of the 20 member task force. The committee was represented by participants from DHEC, MUSC, SC Dept. of Mental Health, Dept. of Human Services, SC Alzheimer's Assn., USC School of Medicine, SC Nurses Assn., SLED, Helping Hands Adult Day Care, SC Technical College System, and other public and private agencies and organizations. Bro. Carlos represented the caregivers, as he was the primary caregiver for his wife Jean for 6 years. Jean passed away from Alzheimer's in 2008.

The Purple Ribbon Committee made 23 recommendations to be implemented in four phases over ten years. Alzheimer's disease is one of the major health problems facing SC and the nation. As the length of life increases, more challenges face us in dealing with this devastating disease. Alzheimer's affects the memory cells of the brain and may manifest itself at any age. However the frequency of its manifestation increases as one ages. There is promising research on the way, and hopefully a cure will be found sometime within this decade.




